Cranbrook House & Gardens was formerly the family estate of Cranbrook Educational Community's founders, George and Ellen Booth. The 1908 home is the oldest surviving manor in the region. The Cranbrook Educational Community campus was designated a National Historic Landmark in 1989. Thousands of local residents and tourists visit Cranbrook House & Gardens during the peak season for historic tours of the English Tudor home, to explore the 40 acres of iconic gardens and the Conservatory Greenhouse, and to experience educational and entertaining events. Consisting of about 350 members, Cranbrook House & Gardens Auxiliary volunteers collectively log over 10,000 hours of service each year.
